

Grand Junction golfer youngest junior titlist

Fourteen-year-old Marc Hocking of Bookcliff Country Club in Grand Junction shot a final-round 72 at Hillcrest Golf Course in Durango yesterday to win the Colorado Golf Association Junior Stroke Play Championship. Hocking, who will be a freshman this fall at Grand Junction High School, became the youngest champion in the 18-year history of the event.

Hocking started the day with a four-shot edge over Jay Osmon of Cattails Golf Course in Alamosa, but Osmon faded out of contention with a final-round 78. Hocking's three-day total of 3-over-par 215 gave him a five-shot win over Joe

Osmon, Jay's twin brother. Joe shot a final-round 69 to move from a tie for sixth to second.
