Dear RMGCSA members,

During these unprecedented times our personal and professional lives are dealing with so much change and so many unknowns we are pleased to be able to provide some clarity to your professional lives.

Today the Governor's office clarified with RMGCSA that golf course maintenance could continue under Section E of the Governors order. RMGCSA sent the original request to the Governor for making golf course maintenance an essential business activity on Sunday March 22, 2020. The Governor's office also made it clear that golf courses are to remain closed to public play. No certification or documentation for employees were included in the e-mail response.

E. Minimum Basic Operations. The minimum necessary activities to (1) maintain the value of the business's inventory, ensure security, process payroll and employee benefits, or for related functions; or (2) facilitate employees of the business being able to continue to work remotely from their Residences are allowable pursuant to this Order. Any business supporting Minimum Basic Operations must comply at all times with Social Distancing Requirements.
