

Rules Referee Training and Certification

The Colorado Golf Association strives to administer the best tournaments in the country with high quality, knowledgeable referees. The goal of the Colorado Golf Association's referee training and certification program is to continually cultivate and develop a volunteer force of tournament referees that help us meet our association goals.

Referees will determine their degree of involvement with the CGA based on their love of the game, available time, and interest in and knowledge of the Rules of Golf. The CGA's responsibility is to provide each referee with the resources and training necessary to fulfill expectations and goals while giving back to the game.

The CGA has three levels of referees based on training received, tournament experience, demonstrated performance and knowledge of the Rules of Golf.

Apprentice level precedes certification and provides initial training to new volunteers. Apprentices will be matched with a mentor who is a Certified Rules Referee to help them through Level 1. Two or more "ride along" days at a CGA tournament will provide opportunities to shadow a Certified Rules Referee and learn on-course procedures for referees. Once an apprentice has satisfactorily completed Level 1, they will decide if they wish to move onto Level 2 and become a Certified Rules Referee and be on-course alone at CGA tournaments. Those wishing to move on will work through satisfactorily completing the referee exam with a mentor.

Certified Rules Referees are comfortable on-course assisting players and have a sound understanding of course set-up and the Rules of Golf. Those wishing to become a mentor have the option of working with apprentices. Those wishing to become a Rules Captain have the option of working with a mentor Rules Captain.

Rules Captains are very comfortable on-course assisting players, have demonstrated ability in tournament operations and leadership roles, and have an advanced understanding of course set-up and the Rules of Golf.



Rules Referee Training and Certification

Level	Requirements
Level 1 Apprentice	 Attend a CGA Rules of Golf Seminar in person <u>or</u> watch the Webinar recordings. Attend the CGA Rules Referee Training Day in person <u>or</u> watch the Apprentice On-Course Refereeing webinar series. Read the CGA On-Course Referee Manual. Complete the CGA Apprentice Exam. *Must complete before first ride along Complete at least two "ride along" days with a Certified Rules Referee. Satisfactorily complete the CGA Apprentice On-Course Checklist during ride alongs.
Level 2 Certified Rules Referee	 Attend a CGA Rules of Golf Seminar in person <u>or</u> watch the Webinar recordings. Attend the CGA Rules Referee Training Day in person <u>or</u> watch the CGA On-Course Refereeing webinar series. Read the CGA On-Course Referee Manual. Satisfactorily complete the CGA Rules Referee Exam by scoring at least 75%. <i>*Must complete once each rules cycle.</i> Referee at least three CGA tournament days each year.
Level 3 Rules Captain	 Meet Level 2 requirements. Read the CGA Rules Captain Manual. Satisfactorily complete <u>either</u> the 80 or 100 question exam by scoring at least 75%. <i>*Must complete once each rules cycle.</i> Captain at least one CGA tournament each year. <u>New Captains:</u> Shadow a Rules Captain before captaining your own tournament. ** Current Rules Captains, and Certified Rules Referees wanting to become a Rules Captain that have successfully completed the exam will have their fee reimbursed. *Once per rules cycle.

Current Rules Cycle	2023 - 2026			
CGA Rules of Golf Seminar/Webinar	One - four hours. Covers a variety of common Rules situations and their practical applications on the golf course. *In person and recorded			
CGA On-Course Refereeing Webinars	Two, one-hour webinars. Covers topics, procedures, and Rules situations specific to on- course refereeing at tournaments. Available at both the Apprentice and Certified Rules Referee level. *Recorded			
CGA Rules Referee Training Day	6 hours. Meet staff and other referees. Covers topics, procedures, and Rules situations specific to on-course refereeing at tournaments.			
Ride Along	Shadow a Certified Rule Referee at a tournament. Learn on-course procedures for referees.			
CGA Apprentice On- Course Checklist	List of topics, procedures, and Rules situations common to on-course tournament referring that must be discussed and demonstrated during ride along. <i>*Checklist available on next page.</i>			
CGA On-Course Referee Manual	Full document covering volunteering with the CGA, course set-up and refereeing procedures, and common Rules refereeing situations.			
CGA Rules Captain Manual	Full document covering Rules Captains roles and responsibilities.			
CGA Apprentice Exam	20 questions on basic Rules knowledge. *Virtual. Open book.			
CGA Rules Referee Exam	40 questions on Rules knowledge. *Virtual. Open book.			
CGA Tournaments	Includes CGA, USGA, CHSAA, and Colorado Opens.
